However Biznet IIS recognises that, like all organisations, our activities, products and services can have an impact on the environment. Biznet IIS has integrated an effective environmental management system to ensure that all business operations are conducted in an environmentally responsible and effective way. This ISO 14001 certification was achieved in October 2010.

The Biznet IIS Environmental Management System is designed to ensure that the company shall:

- Continually improve our environmental performance by setting documented objectives and targets and regularly reviewing progress in achieving these
- As a minimum standard, comply with all relevant environmental legislation and other requirements and prevent pollution
- Manage our resource consumption in such a manner to minimise unnecessary or avoidable use and waste including re-using and then recycling all waste office paper, plastics and cans
- Promote car sharing on business journeys when possible
- Keep office temperatures at the lowest comfortable level
- Purchase supplies locally where possible
- Implement a switch off policy and turn off all electrical equipment when not in use
- Encourage and train staff in environmental awareness and encourage good practice.
